Kathy Barnes, New Hampshire Bird Records webmaster, nominated by Becky Suomala Kathy Barnes has been the Web Master for the New Hampshire Bird Records (NHBR) web site since 2011, redesigning it twice, keeping it up to date throughout the year, and filling emergency needs such as the creation of a new data entry portal for the 2021 Backyard Winter Bird Survey at the last minute. She has been a key part of extending NH Audubon's web presence.

Susan Burkhardt, office assistant, nominated by Becky Suomala

Susan Burkhardt was a new volunteer when COVID-19 in March 2020 and thanks to her flexibility, willingness to do anything, and proximity to the McLane Center, she filled in on many tasks. She processed innumerable Backyard Winter Bird Surveys, took home mailings, and did miscellaneous projects, providing critical help at a challenging time when volunteers could not come into the office.

Andrei Campeanu, Sanctuary Steward, nominated by Phil Brown

Andrei has been a sanctuaries volunteer since 2018 (he actually signed on as a volunteer during that year's annual meeting). He and his trusty battery-powered chainsaw cheerfully travel across the southern tier of the state wherever there is a need to clear trails. He has spent time helping to improve several well-used and less-used trail systems including at the Bellamy River, Deering, and Kensan-Devan Wildlife Sanctuaries. Recently, he spent several days clearing a trail system at the Kensan-Devan Sanctuary in Marlborough, where his volunteer time also served as match for a grant that enabled this trail's redevelopment.
