Massabesic Wildlife Sanctuary Visitor Policy:

- Stay on trails.
- No motorized vehicles.
- Dogs are permitted on wooded trails only and must be leashed at all times. Clean up all messes!
 Take nothing, leave nothing.
- Please do not go in the water. It is Manchester's drinking supply.
- Access to trails is free, but all donations are appreciated and support the grounds, programs and activities at the MAC.
 Suggested donation: \$10/visit

Trails are available daily from dawn to dusk.

Trail Information:

All of our trails are low difficulty with level terrain.

Yellow Trail and Battery Point Loop

- Approximately 3.75 miles to Battery Point and back.
- Clearly Marked with yellow paint and occasional signs.
- Occasional benches for rest.
- Battery Point Loop, marked with red tags, offers great views of Massabesic Lake.

Red Trail and Blueberry Point Extension

- Red Trail alone is a 1 mile loop.
- Clearly marked with red tags.
- Traverse both field and forest.

Check out the old Osprey Viewing Blind on your way to Blueberry Point! *Please note that the field paths may change with each season's mowing.



Directions to 26 Audubon Way, Auburn NH

- 1. From I-93 and points west and north and south of Manchester, take Exit 7 to Route 101 East (Seacoast). Watch for the Audubon signs.
- 2. From points east of Manchester, go west towards Manchester on Route 101. Watch for the Audubon signs.
- 3. Take Exit 1 and go south onto Route 28 By-pass. Travel 1/8 miles to the traffic circle.
- 4. Proceed half way through the circle, continuing on the Route 28 By-pass. You'll see Lake Massabesic on your left.
- 5. Travel 1.9 miles to Spofford Road. Turn left onto Spofford Road for 1/4 mile.
- 6. Turn left onto Audubon Way (on the corner as Spofford Road veers right).

The parking lot is on the left, opposite the Center.
